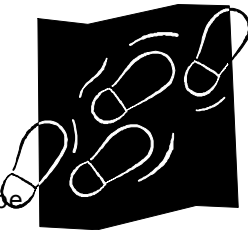
Conference Information

In the summer of 2003, Edmonton will host community representatives from around the world at the First Global Conference on Learning Communities.

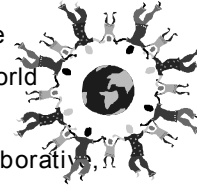
