

FACULTY MOBILITY

Beyond research and PHD student mobility, we have established 2 types of Faculty Teaching mobility modalities

- 1. Short term (3 days to one week)
 - Academic Leaders
 - Global Faculty week



- 2. One Semester to one year teaching activities
 - Visiting professor programs



The Global Faculty Week

- Created in 2009
- GFW has brought together more than 88 faculty members from 56 partner universities.
- Faculty has have contact with more than 31,680 students.



LÍDERES ACADÉMICOS



- Created in 2008 as an attempt to go beyond traditional University Education.
- Provides direct interaction between students and experts in their fields at conferences, workshops, lectures and visits.
- Academic Leaders introduce students to case studies allowing them to apply theory and knowledge to professional life experiences.
- For the last 8 years this program has attracted 38 leaders per year total of 304 academic experts.
- More than 28,000 students have attended to any activity.



Visitor Professor Program

Created in 2013, this program enhances the strengthening of our academic standards in diverse areas of specialty by linking their content to the industry.

- An average of 11 international faculty is attracted every year to our Campus. Each Faculty interacts for a full semester with an average of 90 students.
- Total of 33 professors.
- 2,970 students

Queretaro is located in the central region of Mexico.


It has a population of approximately 1.9 million people.

• Queretaro also hosts one of the most advanced aerospace clusters in the country (Harvard Business School, 2015).





Interesting Facts

- Santiago de Querétaro is the capital of the state of Querétaro.
- The weather is mild and quite pleasant most of the year, the temperature ranges between 16° and 22°C.
- The historic region of Santiago de Querétaro was declared a World Heritage Site by UNESCO in 1996.
- The living standard in Santiago de Querétaro is among the highest in México and Latin America, mainly due to the low crime and unemployment rates.
- It is the metropolitan area with the highest per capita GDP in México (ProMéxico, 2016).
